CANADIAN AVALANCHE CENTRE

The Canadian Avalanche Centre officially opened its doors on October 15, 1991. The Centre is located on the second floor of the Post Office building in Revelstoke, British Columbia where Canadian Parks Services maintains its local offices.

The opening ceremony, chaired by Chris Stethem (President of the Canadian Avalanche Association), was attended by the local member of the provincial legislature, the Mayor of Revelstoke, representatives of the skiing industry and directors and members of the Canadian Avalanche Association. Chris Stethem acknowledged the support of the industry, provincial and federal governments that made it possible to establish the Centre. The industry and the members of the Canadian Avalanche Association are thankful to Chris for his dedication and efforts in making the Centre a reality.

The principal activities of the Canadian Avalanche Centre are to organize training schools, maintain a snow stability information exchange for industry, and to provide avalanche information for the public. These activities were described in AVALANCHE NEWS NO. 35.

The Centre has three staff members. Alan Dennis is the full-time coordinator and is responsible for the operation of the Centre and the coordination of activities and business development for the Canadian Avalanche Association as directed by its directors. The technical officer, Chris Whalley is responsible for the network and operations of the information exchange, the equipment for communication and training schools, and the technical support of training. The duties of Inge Anhorn, the administrator on a part-time basis include the administration of the training schools, bookkeeping and services to the members of the Canadian Avalanche Association.

The Canadian Avalanche Centre is looking forward to success in the winter of 1991-1992 and the future.

CANADIAN AVALANCHE ASSOCIATION TRAINING SCHOOLS

As in previous years, the Canadian Avalanche Association through its Avalanche Centre offers training courses for personnel of operations that are concerned with avalanche safety: maintenance of highways, railways, and powerlines; ski areas; ski guiding; park operation. In addition, the courses are attended by people who seek education in greater depth than is usually offered in short avalanche safety courses.

Course locations are Whistler, British Columbia; Blue River, British Columbia; Mistaya Lodge near Golden, British Columbia; Ptarmigan Hut near Kimberley. British Columbia; Mount Engadine Lodge near Canmore, Alberta; Creston, British Columbia and Stewart, British Columbia.

AVALANCHE INVOLVEMENT

The Canadian Avalanche Centre will continue work initiated in 1969 by the National Research Council by collecting and analyzing statistics about persons and equipment involved with avalanches in Canada. Summaries of the reported avalanche encounters — published annually in the June issue of AVAIANCHE NEWS have attracted the attention of the public, media, governments and industries and have assisted in drawing attention to avalanche hazards and avalanche safety.

Anybody who has had an encounter with an avalanche (with a lucky escape or more seriously), or has witnessed or heard about an avalanche encounter is urged to let the Centre know about it. Not only encounters of persons, but also damage to property, for example vehicles, buildings, lifts, powerlines, telephone lines, guard rails should be reported.

The message may be submitted by using the form created for this purpose (printed in the <u>Guidelines</u> for Weather, Snowpack and Avalanche Observations), a written note in any format, telephone, fax or word of mouth. The participants of the snow stability information exchange should include information about involvements in their daily message, and that would be all that is required. The information is kept confidential and will be released in summary form only. The names and person involved need not to be mentioned.

The lack of snow in many areas of the Alps obviously was the reason. Instead of skiing, people simply hiked.
